May this letter serve as my endorsement for Westie Rescue-Michigan.

I have worked alongside this rescue group since 2009 as they seek care for Westie Highland Terriers that have been surrendered by their owners, found as strays, shown up in shelters, or rescued from breeding mills. The primary goal of Westie Rescue Michigan "is to be the safety net for all homeless Michigan Westie's who do not have a responsible breeder that will stand behind them in their time of need."

All Westie rescues that pass through our hospital are tested and treated for intestinal parasites, as well as heartworm disease. They are then placed on Sentinel for monthly heartworm and parasite control. Also, a wellness blood panel is done to test values such as: ALKP, ALT, Alb, Glb, BUN, creatinine, glucose, K, and a full cbc. They are microchipped and treated for all other health issues prior to being placed in foster care for future adoption. Westie Rescue has "saved" many Westie Highland Terriers that were to be euthanized due to treatment costs or kill shelters.

Any person, shelter, or clinic that has a Westie in need can take comfort in knowing that by transferring to Westie Rescue- Michigan, the animal will be treated well, receive the proper care, and find its' way into a new loving home.
