To Whom It May Concern,

May this letter serve as my endorsement for Westie Rescue Michigan.

I have worked with this group since 2002 as they seek care for West Highland Terriers that have been given up by their owners, found as strays, rescued from breeding mills or have shown up in shelters. Westie Rescue Michigan's "primary goal is to be the safety net for all homeless Michigan Westies who do not have a responsible breeder who will stand behind them in their time of need."

All Westie Rescue's that pass through our hospital are tested and treated for external and intestinal parasites, tested for heartworm disease and placed on Sentinel Spectrum for monthly parasite control. All have preventative or screening blood testing (ALKP, ALT, Alb, Glb, BUN, Total Protein, Creatinine, Glucose, K and a full CBC). They are microchipped. All are treated for their dental disease and other health issues prior to being placed in foster care for future adoption. Most of these animals have required extensive care to overcome severe skin infections secondary to poorly managed allergic disease. Westie Rescue has "saved" many Westies that were to be euthanized by their owners or shelters due to the cost of treatment.

Any person or shelter that has a West Highland Terrier in need can take comfort in knowing that by transferring that Westie to the Westie Rescue Michigan, the pet will be treated well, will receive all proper care, and will find its way into a loving home.
